Location: Chewelah Peak Learning Center (CPLC), 9 miles east of Chewelah, WA. Use the Flowery Trail Road heading toward 49 Degrees North Ski Area. Address: 3215 Flowery Trail Road, Chewelah WA 99109.

Accommodations: One Large Bunk House, using only the lower bunks.

Let us know when you register if you need an accommodation to suit your health issues. (example: sleep pack).

WHAT TO BRING WITH YOU

- 1.YOUR KNITTING NEEDLES, LOOMS, WHEELS,ETC.
2. Your own bedding--clean plastic sealed mattresses are provided. Your own towels and pillows. If you bring any electrical appliance, be sure to bring an extension cord.
3. Personal toiletries.
4. The weather in May can be beautiful--and cool. Bring sweaters or coats, umbrellas, etc. Activities are spread out between a couple of buildings, you will be walking from building to building, the dining hall and to your sleeping quarters.
5. A flashlight--although the buildings are lighted outside at night.
6. Snacks for yourself and to share, if you so desire. There will be a community refreshments table.

7. A folding lawn chair to use wherever you might need it and around the fire circle on Friday and Saturday nights.
8. If you wish to enjoy a glass of wine in the evening, please feel free to bring your own and a glass.

WHAT IS PROVIDED

There are straight back chairs for seating. Those attendees wishing to sell products will have spaces but need to bring their own set-ups, table and chairs. This is a first come first serve basis. No extra lighting is provided, but you may bring your own as well as an extension cord--we suggest that you do so.

Meals: In the lodging package, you will receive the number of meals in accordance with your accommodations. Please see registration form for costs and packages. We must give CPLC a meal count on 04/06/2015. No meals will be sold after that time. There are no vending machines or ATMs at CPLC.

Refreshment Table: Coffee, tea, hot water, cups are available in the cafeteria all day. Napkins and small plates are provided on the refreshment table for snacks.

Cleanup: Each dorm will have cleaning supplies provided as well as brooms and mops. Each participant is expected to clean her/his own area in both the dorms and the common area. You will sign-up to help with the cleaning of the bathrooms and the cafeteria. Please help us avoid a cleanup charge.
