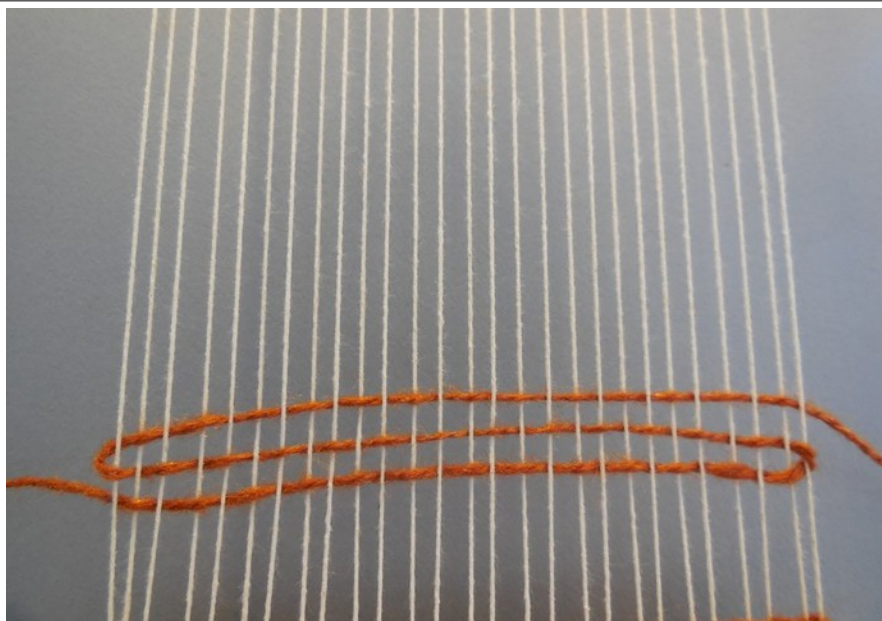




Knitting on the Loom Hemstitch



The Sample

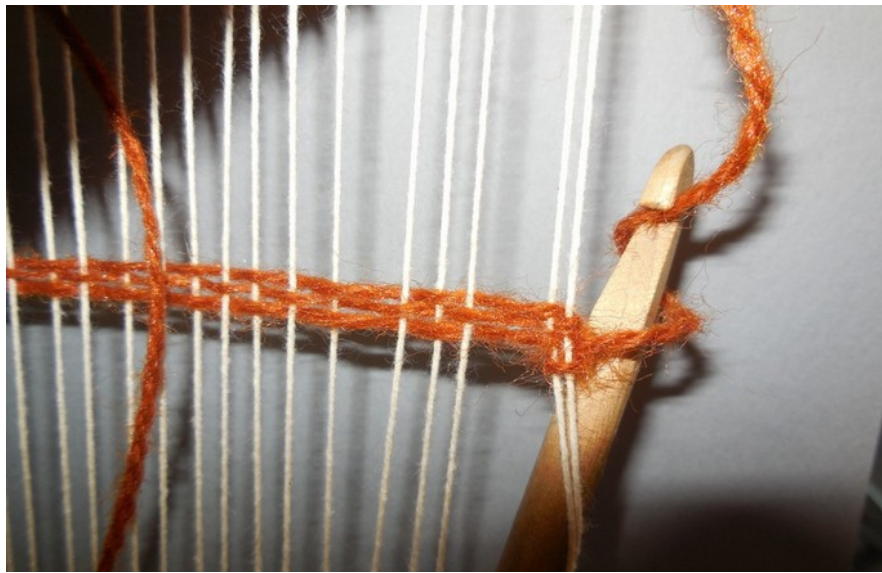


To begin: Throw a few shots plain weave



At selvage, catch working yarn (weft) on crochet hook around 2 warp ends to form loop. Catch yarn again around hook.

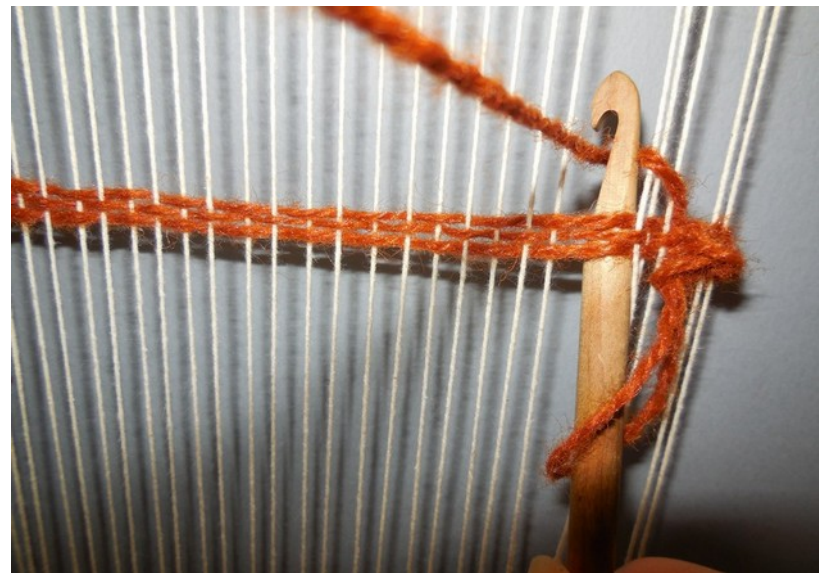




Insert hook between same 2 warp ends, below weaving, underneath woven shots, and up. Catch working yarn on hook.

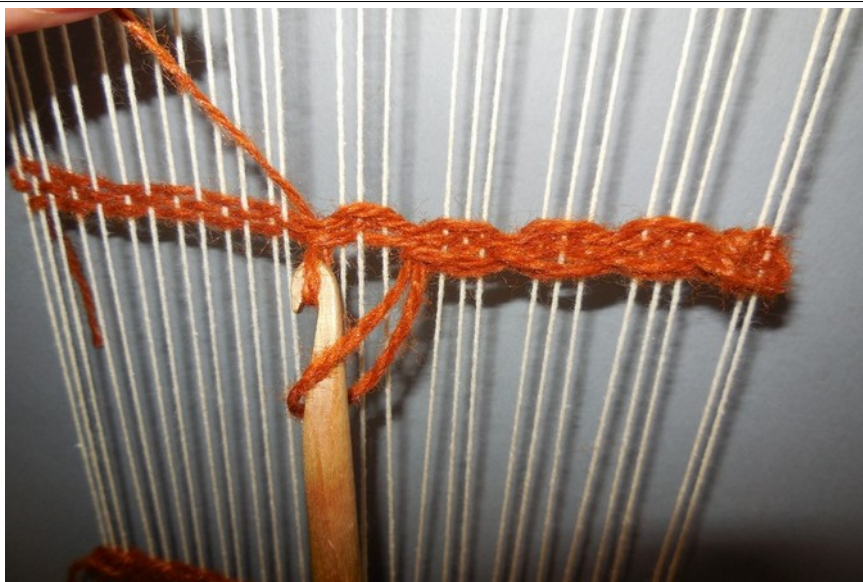


Pull yarn through loop, leaving a new loop on the hook.

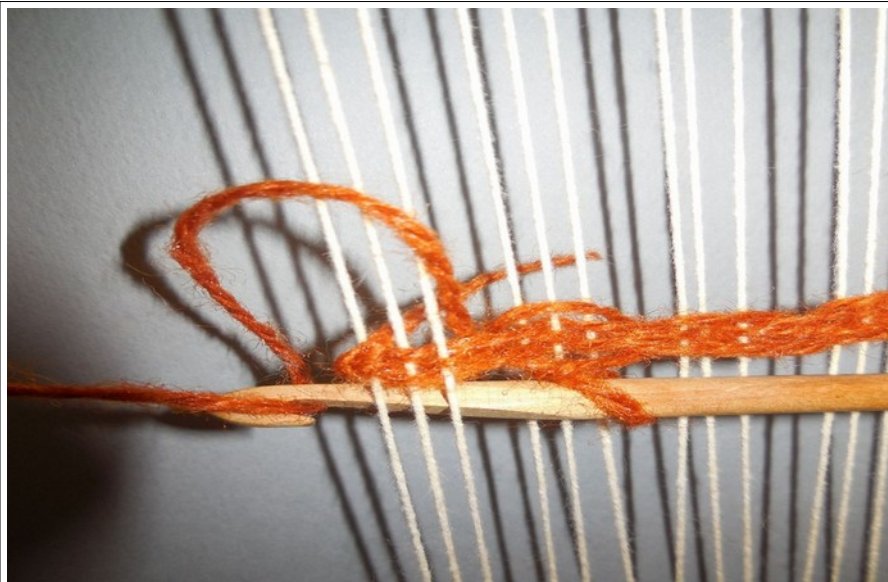


Move over several warp ends. Enter hook below woven weft and up above it. Catch working yarn, pull through loop on hook and pull taut.





Continue across width of weaving: over some warps, under woven area; up through same warp space, catch yarn and loop through. Pull taut.



At end selvage, draw loop from around end warp bundle and loop through on hook.



Pull working yarn through loop a second time



Expand loop until large enough to insert shuttle through. Pull up close and begin your weaving project.





At end of project: Reverse procedure. Bring up loop onto hook at selvage edge – twice.



Move across several warp ends. Hook goes under several woven rows, up to surface. Catch working yarn and pull through loop. Tension 'til smooth



Continue across width: over a few warps, down and through weaving, up and catch working yarn, pull taut



At selvage, loop around end warps, pull yarn through loop



Catch working yarn through loop a second time and pull until smooth.
