Explore the remarkable versatility of Turned Beiderwand with instructor Karen Donde in this two-session virtual workshop. Turned Beiderwand is a structure that allows weavers to create multiple patterning effects from a single threading—an elegant, flexible approach that opens the door to both subtle and bold design possibilities.

Across two consecutive Saturdays, Karen will guide participants through how the structure works, how warp-faced and weft-faced areas interact, how to manage blocks, and how to plan designs that shift simply by changing tie-ups, treadlings, or liftplans. Participants will have time between sessions to weave samples, experiment, and return with questions for deeper discussion.

Karen's teaching is clear, encouraging, and wonderfully practical, making this workshop accessible to intermediate weavers and inspiring for anyone ready to explore structure more deeply with their multi-shaft loom.
